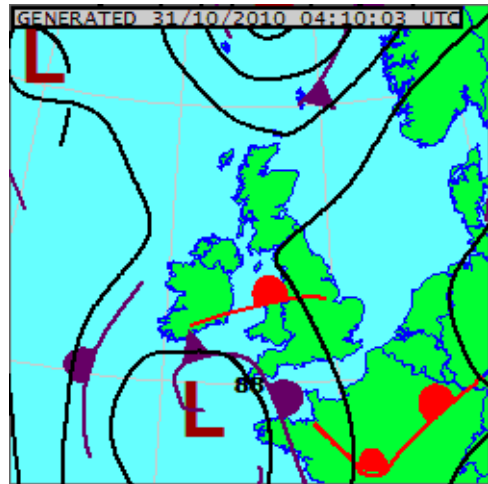

Synopsis & discussion:

Low pressure is passing eastwards through southern parts of England today. This is going to be a weak feature, with an associated occluded front to the north of it weakening across the north of Wales and northern England through this afternoon. Flying should be possible as cloud breaks during the afternoon. Monday looks good for flying once morning cloud breaks. Sunny spells will develop.



Forecast Skew-T for 1300 BST:

A drying skew-t showing the cloud tending to break in medium and low levels, although remaining moist north of 600mb.

Cloud (above sea level):

8/8 Sc 1500ft slowly lifting and breaking to 6/8 Sc 2500ft.

Weather:

Low risk of early drizzle, this fading to leave conditions mainly fair.

Wind:

Surface: 090/14kt, slowly backing.
 3,000ft: 100/16-18kt slowly easing.

Thermal start & end: 10am to 3pm

Thermal strength: 0 to 2kt

Temperature Max/Min: 11/8

Visibility: 5km in any early drizzle, then 20-25km.

QNH @ 1200Z: 999, rising.

Outlook for next few days:

Fair for Monday with sunny spells and good flying conditions.

Tuesday will be windy, becoming wet later. Wet through Wednesday and probably staying wet for Thursday too.
