



# MIDLAND GLIDING CLUB WEATHER FORECAST



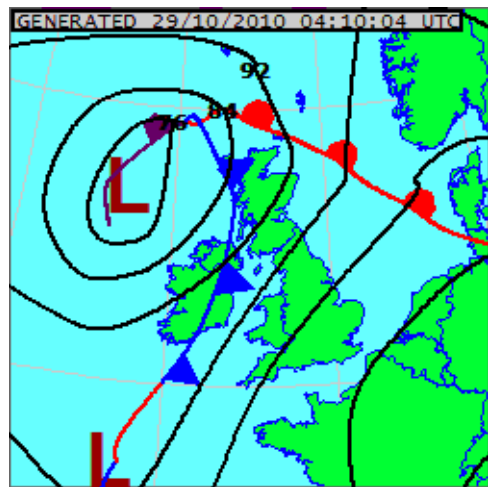

### Synopsis & discussion:

A broad, moist warm sector is going to be covering the Mynd area through today. This brings plenty of cloud with is, although at times the cloud should break allowing some brief bright spells. There is the risk of some low cloud developing across the Mynd through this afternoon as the flow moistens further. Saturday looks brighter as a cold front crosses overnight tonight.; Following will be drier air with sunny spells and limited cloud amounts, Thermals should be reasonable, the ridge probably working in the morning but then slowly switching off as the winds back into the afternoon.



### Forecast Skew-T for 1300 BST:

Signs of breaks in the cloud on the midday forecast skew-t. Thicker cloud at higher levels. The tephigrams moisten further this afternoon.

### Cloud (above sea level):

7/8 Sc 4000ft with 8/8 Cs above. Becoming 8/8 St 1200ft at times early and late.

### Weather:

Outbreaks of drizzle this morning, fading for a time, then returning this afternoon and evening.

### Wind:

Surface: 190/20-25kt  
 3,000ft: 200/35kt

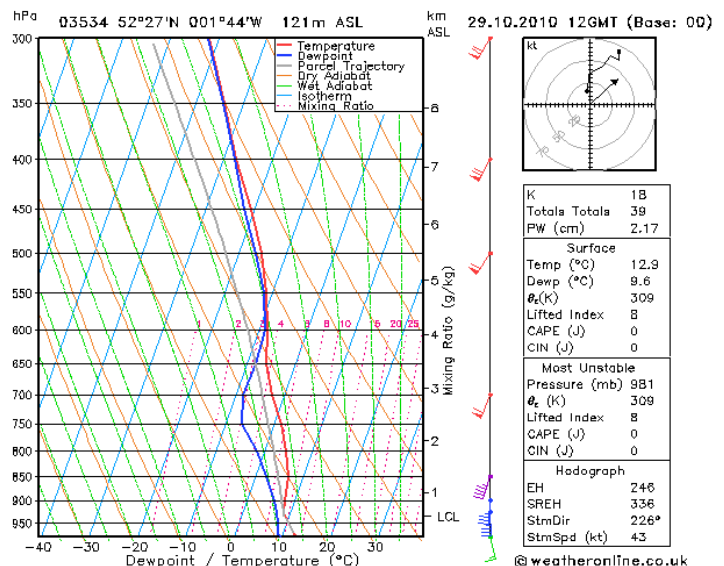
**Thermal start & end:** 10am to 1pm

**Thermal strength:** 0 to 2kt

**Temperature Max/Min:** 12/10

**Visibility:** 12-15km but 100m in drizzle when cloud settles on the hill and 3000m in rain.

**QNH @ 1200Z:** 992, falling slowly.



### Outlook for next few days:

Much better on Saturday in sunny spells and some good flying to be found. Sunday looks cloudier with outbreaks of rain, although low confidence in the forecast. Broken cloud through Monday, limited flying, then outbreaks of rain on Tuesday too but the ridge working.
