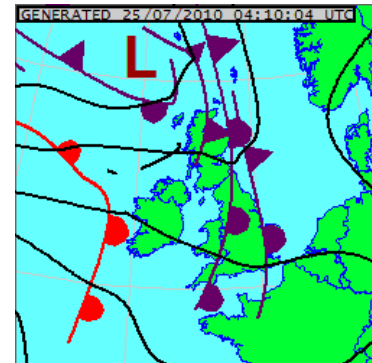

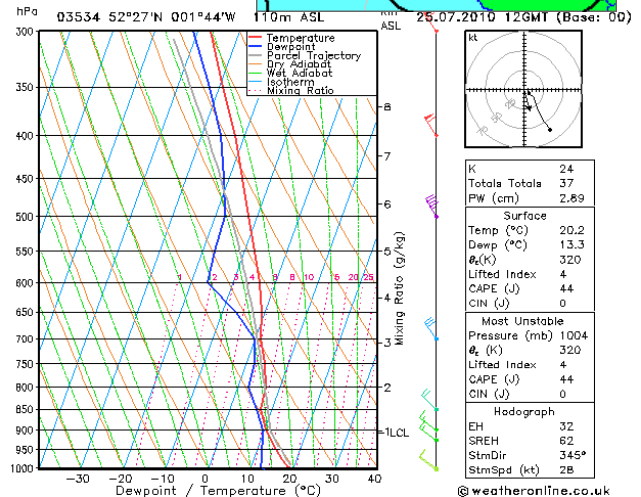
Synopsis & discussion:

Despite pressure being high across the country, we are in a moist airstream with weak fronts mainly to the west and to the east of the Long Mynd area. Tomorrow morning a weak warm front moves in from the west and pushes away during the afternoon. Today prob looks best to the east and the south east as more breaks are likely to the lee of the hills.



Forecast Tephigram for 1200:

NW flow increase with height, DALR to 5,000ft with broken deck cloud suggested in lower, mid and upper levels. Looks overdone.

A dry day with sunny spells, more cloud develops
