



MIDLAND GLIDING CLUB WEATHER FORECAST



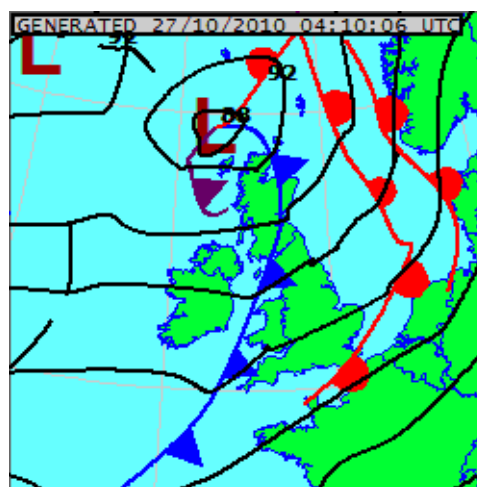

Synopsis & discussion:

With warm sector conditions through the Mynd all day we are in for a breezy one. There will be breaks in the cloud, especially this morning which could present a good opportunity for flying. Just be aware that bases could fall quickly in any drizzle should more moist pockets of air come along.
 Drizzle for Friday morning and windy again. The cloud again breaking with a few bright spells developing, although it is likely to increase again later bringing a further risk of some outbreaks of drizzle and light rain later in the afternoon.



Forecast Skew-T for 1300 BST:

A moist tephigram today, although I suspect that the airmass will dry slightly this afternoon..

Cloud (above sea level):

8/8 NSt 2500ft but 1200ft at times in any drizzle or rain, then lifting 6-7/8 Sc 3000ft at times, but 8/8 StNs 1500ft in any drizzle.

Weather:

Broken cloud with the threat of some outbreaks of drizzle.

Wind:

Surface: 220/20kt
 3,000ft: 240/25-30kt

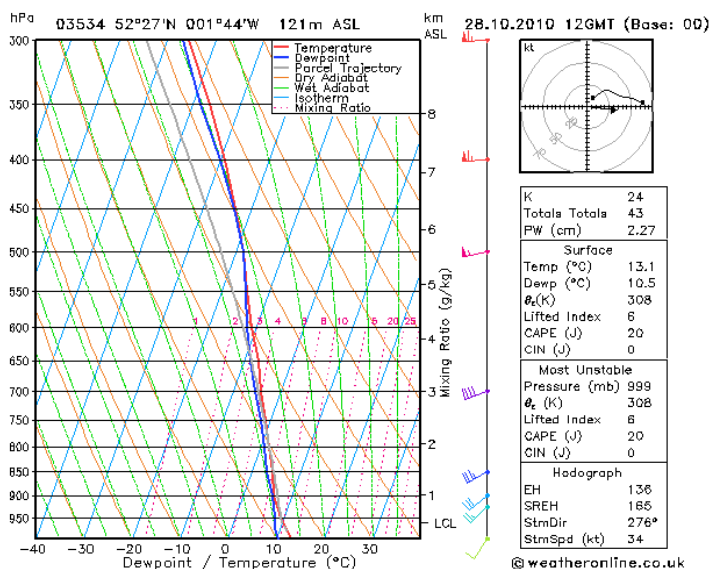
Thermal start & end: 10am to 4pm

Thermal strength: 0 to 2kt

Temperature Max/Min: 12/10

Visibility: 15-20km but 100m in drizzle when cloud settled on the hill.

QNH @ 1200Z: 1012, falling slowly.



Outlook for next few days:

Similar conditions for Friday, although an increased threat of rain later.
 Saturday should be a mainly fair day with sunny spells and reasonable flying possibilities.
 Sunday is likely to be cloudier with periods of rain, conditions remaining unsettled into next week.
