



# MIDLAND GLIDING CLUB WEATHER FORECAST



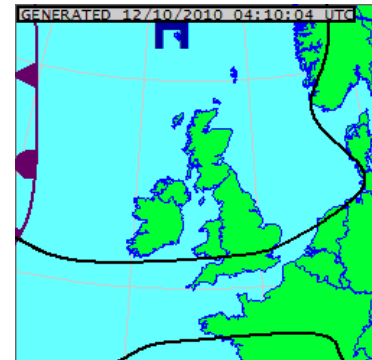

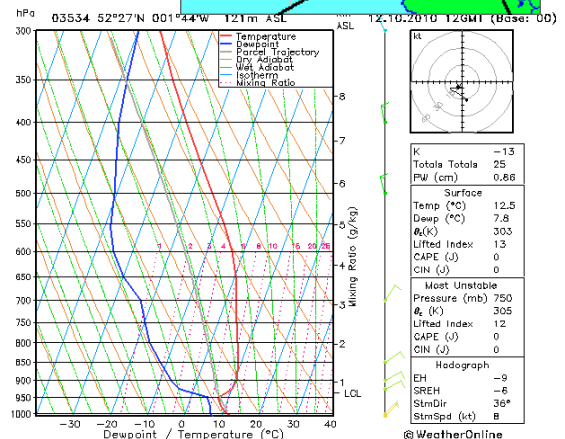
### Synopsis & discussion:

Today an area of high pressure will be centred to the north of the United Kingdom and this will keep it settled across the country. The north east wind persists but will moderate. High pressure will dominate for much of the upcoming week. We keep a prevailing north east wind flow which is expected to keep fairly cloudy conditions through the rest of the week.



### Forecast Tephigram for 1200:

Little change from yesterday as it stays very stable with that ridge of high pressure across the area resulting in that persistent subsidence inversion around 950mb. Low level cloud trapped beneath the inversion may linger all day with Generally poor soaring conditions.



### Cloud (above sea level):

7-8 Sc 1,200ft rising to 6-7 Sc 2,500ft this afternoon

**Outlook for next few days:** Cloudy on Wednesday with some hill fog, bits of drizzle over the hills.

Throughout the rest of the outlook period we keep the north east wind and generally it looks cloudy with a risk of a few pots of drizzle possible in the mornings with mist over the hills. This cloud will be trapped below a strong subsidence inversion.
