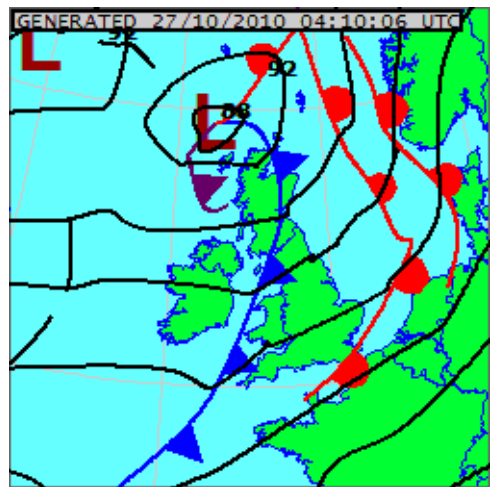

Synopsis & discussion:

A cold front has now moved eastwards through the Mynd area with a brisk southwest flow following through today. Flying conditions should be good and the ridge is likely to be working too.

Tomorrow is a fair day too with some spells of sunshine in the morning. Cloud is going to be increasing through the day, although flying conditions should remain good overall.



Forecast Skew-T for 1300 BST:

The skew-t for midday today shows conditions drying out above 900mb, although it does hit at spreadout around 900mb.

Fair, dry, sunny spells.

Surface: 240/16kt
 3,000ft: 250/20kt

Thermal start & end: 10am to 4pm

QNH @ 1200Z: 1015, falling slowly.

Outlook for next few days:

Reasonable flying again for Thursday. Friday sees a front to the west and southerly winds, but flying is likely, especially to early afternoon. Saturday appears reasonable too, although Sunday looks unsettled.
